And the last about head lice.....

Just when you've thought that there's nothing more to learn about head lice, there's more. There is the part that parents can do. And probably the most important is don't panic. If you keep in mind what you already know about head lice, and what the school is doing, your job will become clearer and "make more sense".

*When your child brings a note home from school alerting you to head lice in the classroom, PLEASE check thoroughly every day for the next week.

*If you find live lice on your child please treat him/her promptly. There are several over-the-counter products, both in the general pharmacies and health food stores. Some people think that because you need a prescription for Quell that it is the most effective. The reason a prescription is needed is because of the neuro toxicity associated with Quell, not its effectiveness. Another prescription treatment is **Ovide**, which has been proven to be very effective in killing lice. Because each of these products is so different, it is very important to follow the package directions carefully.

*Please notify the school if your child is being treated for head lice.

*Pay close attention to the removal of nits. Even the best lice killing shampoos will kill 60-70% of nits. Any nits remaining will hatch and reinfest the child within 2 weeks.

*The most effective nit combs are NOT found in the lice killing product box. Metal nit combs are sold separately and can make all the difference in complete nit removal.

*The use of sprays, disinfectants or "bug bombs" is not effective in treating head lice. Head lice simply shut down their respiratory system when confronted with pesticides. Unfortunately we don't.

*Be wise in your cleaning and vacuuming. Remember, head lice cannot live beyond 12 hours without a blood meal. Concentrate on those areas that your child's head has come in contact with during the past 12 hours.

*Send in a plastic grocery bag to store your child's coat, hat and scarf in. And continue to reinforce that children do not share hats, hair gear and such.

* And finally, always feel free to call me for more information on detecting and treating head lice. I don't always have all the right answers but together we can work on the solutions.

Thanks again for all your reading and your help in tackling a very pesty problem.
